Partner Agency: Catholic Charities

Financial assistance (rent, utilities, food pantry, propane, water, sewer) mobile food pantry, medication assistance of various types, tax preparation assistance, legal services for simple civil matters, school supplies for the beginning of the school year, clothing vouchers and clothing at low cost, and counseling are some of the reasons people of Crawford County turn to Catholic Charities for assistance. United Way helps us provide some of these services to the people of Crawford County. Many of the people who are helped by these services you will probably never see or know; however, they know that people within their community are concerned about their welfare and they are grateful.

One lady sends a card, saying that she prays every day for the donors who remember her and give to agencies such as Catholic Charities.

Another lady wrote to us thanking us for helping her with her utility bill. Her husband had been in the hospital for 5 days. Her work hours had been cut and they got behind on their bills. Catholic Charities paid \$100 toward her utility bill and that helped tremendously. She didn't want any other assistance currently.

Program

Developments/Happenings: I will focus on our Behavioral Health Services. We continue to host Catholic Charities twice a month for in person counseling sessions (with 8-10 clients seen each month). We also continue to host Dr. Harshawat for telehealth sessions each month (averaging 17- clients each month).

We are continuing to research and work on developing a behavioral health center or community mental health center for Crawford County. Our Americorps member attends monthly Community Behavioral Health Association meetings held in Mt.

Vernon. She has completed a clinic policy and procedure manual and will assist the department in completing a community mental health center pregualification application.

Special Events: As part of our outreach, in September we participated in the Labor Day parade as well as the second annual Mental Health Awareness Day and Out of the Darkness Walk. We also just participated in the Heath Harvest parade.




Our Second Annual Banquet is on November 7th, 2019 at Highland Woods Community Center in Vincennes.
