## **LGBTQ**

Imagine not feeling accepted at home, in your community or at school because of your gender identity or sexual orientation. Like race and socioeconomic status, inequities for people identifying as lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender (LGBTQ) can be seen across many dimensions, including healthcare, education, and in the workplace. Research from the American Progress Institute shows that LGBTQ individuals experience widespread discrimination, often manifesting itself as getting passed over for promotions, being bullied in schools, being refused healthcare, or being denied equal treatment at a store or hotel. The intersectionality of race and sexual orientation and gender identity also has compounding effects on individuals' well-being: Black transgender and gender nonconforming individuals experience some of the highest levels of discrimination and threats on their personal safety.
